

## **The Voice of God: Written Activation re: The Nation**

In this activation, you will be given an opportunity to hear the Voice of God for yourself, and the value of writing what God has spoken to you personally:

Still believing and being sensitive to how God to speak to you by hearing, sensing or seeing.

1. *Go ahead and get your pen, pencil and paper. Or your computer to write what you believe God speaks:*

*-Pray that God will speak to you and then you will write what you hear*

*-Remember the scripture, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them and they follow me." (John 10:27); Praying that they will hear the Christ within. Encouraging them to listen to the Holy Spirit.*

*- Just listen, hear what the Lord is saying, being sober, not mysterious, we receive in part.*

2. *Pray this prayer: "Heavenly Father I believe scripture, 1 Corinthians 2:16," that my body is the temple of the Holy Spirit and that I have the mind of Christ, and that I will receive a thought from the throne room of God, not base on my preconceived ideas or thoughts but from God concerning This nation of America in this season, or in the future or even in past seasons.*

3. *Go silent in order to hear; and begin writing from your spirit and not your mind. Remember that according to Hebrews 5:14 it is by reason of use that you can tell if you are receiving from a soulish mind or the mind of Christ.*

*The Lord speaks to students in a variety of ways and so hearing the Voice of God could be reflected as serious, and others may reflect humor or seem funny. And both can reflect the unique way God speaks to each student.*
